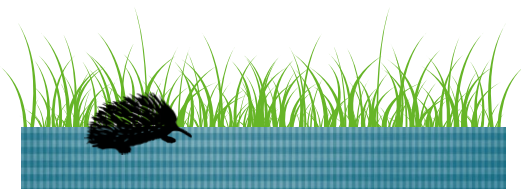

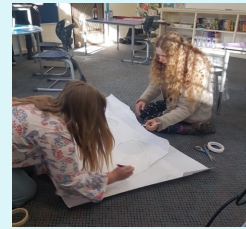

1. Familiarise yourself with the Backyard Species Discovery project (<https://sites.google.com/view/backyardspeciesdiscovery/home>), particularly the factsheet "[How to make your observations count](#)".
2. Develop YOUR OWN instructions (using a short video, photos/ photo collage, words or a mix) to teach others the BEST WAY to capture images of species for iNaturalist (the citizen science platform we use for the Backyard Species Discovery project). Get creative! Think about how your entry might stand out from the crowd.
 - a. You can develop general instructions, or you may like to focus on one type of plant or animal – e.g. fungi, snails, seashells or flowering plants.
 - b. Think about your audience. You can pitch your instructions at adults, teenagers or small children. We are looking for clear instructions that will give your audience the best chance of a correct identification.
- c. Your instructions can be scientific and serious, or a bit light-hearted and fun. Check out our "How to make a mini-beast catcher" on YouTube for ideas <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=txQl2Fw0lho>
3. Submit your entries to bushblitz@awe.gov.au by midnight on Wednesday 17th June. Applications will be judged by a panel, and the winning entry will be announced on Friday 19th June.

We were so excited to reopen for our Click & Collect service from Monday 1 June 2020. Just place your holds online and select the branch you want to pick your items up from. Once the items are available, you will be notified by email or SMS that they are ready to be picked up! You can then attend your selected branch between 10.00am to 2.00pm and 3.00pm to 6.00pm* Monday to Thursday and 10.00am to 2.00pm and 3.00pm to 5.00pm Friday and Saturday** to collect your holds using our self-loan stations. Please note the libraries are currently open for Click & Collect only. The service is not staffed and you are not able to enter the library to browse, study or use the PCs. Our return chutes have also reopened 24/7, although all current loans have been extended until 30 June.

If you're not sure what to borrow for your family you can also check out our Family Fun Bundles! Email details of the age and interests of your family and of course your library card number and we will select books especially for you to collect.
