Emergency Procedures- Fire Danger Period

Christmas Hills Primary School is a category 1 Bushfire At Risk School. This means that we have some additional planning and processes in place to prepare for the bushfire season. Please familiarise yourself with some of these procedures which are outlined below.

If the Fire Danger Rating (FDR) for the Nillumbik Council is Severe or Extreme we relocate to Yering Primary School. The FDF for Nillumbik is at times different to the FDR for the Central Weather District and I understand that this can be confusing, however as a Department of Education school our relocation plan is triggered by the FDR for the Local Government Area (LGA), rather than the Weather District. I am committed to communicating this information as soon as it becomes available and have been in discussions with the Department of Education to refine this process.

If the Fire Danger Rating (FDR) for the Nillumbik Council is Code Red the school is closed.

If at any time we need to take shelter in place we are fortunate to have received an upgrade in 2019 to our 'Shelter in Place' or Art room and work closely with the local CFA to support our planning and preparedness.

In the event of having to evacuate off site due to a fire in the local area staff and students will be evacuated by buses to either Kangaroo Ground Primary School or Yarra Glen Primary School where parents will be asked to collect their child when it is safe to do so.

If at any time your family chooses to enact your own personal fire plan which may differ from the school's procedure please inform the school via text message.

If this topic raises any concerns for you or your family please make a time to discuss it further with the school to ensure we are supporting your family.
