More data this week! What a surprise! We expanded on the previous week and had a look at how data can be presented in different ways. The younger students had a go at recording data accurately by counting how many times they did a particular exercise in 15 to 30s. The older students worked with Microsoft excel or created column graphs in their own books to analyse data they collected by rolling balls through a tube and measuring the distance travelled.

We ask that you please collect any holds between Thursday 18 and Sunday 21 February, as the library will be closed for the next few months. The return chute will also not be available during this time.

From Monday 1 March, we will be operating a Click & Collect service from the Nillumbik Council offices, just next door to the library.

If you still want to browse our collection or use a computer, we have eight other branches across Yarra Plenty Regional Library, as well as the Mobile Library and the Hurstbridge Hub. The closest branches to Diamond Valley Library are Watsonia Library and Eltham Library.
